Course Description

7th Grade Spanish is an introductory course that will build students' foundational communicative skills (speaking, listening, writing, and reading) in Spanish as well as engage students with the cultures of the Spanish-speaking world. This course will incorporate technology and a multitude of interactive activities and projects for students to creatively show their development towards Spanish proficiency. Because in eighth grade students take Spanish I for high school credit, this course allows students to develop a deeper understanding of Spanish.

Classroom Expectations

1. **Be prompt and prepared** - Come to class on time with all necessary materials each day.
2. **Be respectful**...to yourself, your classmates, Sr. Sikkenga, and the classroom.
3. **Take responsibility for your own learning** - If you need help, please ask. If you are absent, it is your responsibility to find out what you missed and make it up.
4. **Speak Spanish as much as possible** - Like with a sport, you are only going to improve your Spanish by practicing it often.

Leaving Class

Students will have **3** opportunities to leave class to go to the bathroom or their locker per 9 week grading period, so it is advised that they use their passing time wisely. Students may not leave class, however, in the middle a teacher-directed portion of the lesson or prior to completing their warmup at the beginning of class.

Grading
